All welcome.

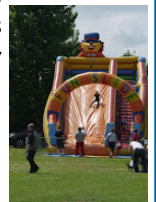

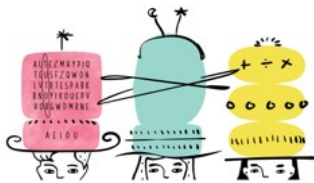

This year there is little time for a break as Easter is so late. We are already looking forward to our Parish weekend away at the beginning of May, when around 70 of us will be travelling to Ditchingham on the Norfolk/Suffolk border where Tricia Troughton will be leading our reflections, with separate groups for the children and youth.

Could you be a Street Aid Champion?

Street Aid helps people on the street to turn a corner in their lives. We do this by raising money so that people who are homeless – or who have been in the past – can apply for something that will help them to get off, or stay off, the streets. If you want to help people on the streets, but don't want to give directly to individuals, Street Aid provides an alternative way of helping.

Since Street Aid was set up in November 2016 it has raised over £50,000 and given out grants to over 150 people. We are now looking to recruit more volunteers, Street Aid Champions, so that everyone who lives or works in the city knows about Street Aid.

Street Aid Champions hold fundraising events in their workplace, university or local community. These can be small events, such as bake sales or dress-down days; or bigger events, such as organising a sponsored run or cycle ride, or holding a music event. Champions are also Street Aid ambassadors - who tell people about Street Aid and promote what we do.

Street Aid Champions can claim time credits as a reward for giving their time. Time credits can be spent on accessing activities, such as exercise classes, or cinema and theatre tickets in Cambridge and further afield.

Champions will receive a fundraising pack to help them with running their events, and will be managed by Street Aid's Volunteer Coordinator who will run group training sessions, and be available to provide support as needed.
